MINISTER OF MARINE IS HERE

Hon. Mr. Ballantyne Inspects Harbor, Addresses Canadian Club and Meets Officials

Hon. C. C. Ballantyne, minister of marine and fisheries, arrived in the city in his private car attached to the night express from Halifax early today. He spent the morning looking over the harbor and the harbor facilities.

At 1 o'clock was the guest of the Canadian Club at luncheon and this afternoon at 3 o'clock he will confer with the local commissioners and representatives of the board of trade in city hall.

Accompanied by the local members of parliament, the mayor, the president and secretary of the board of trade, officials of the marine and harbor departments, shipping men and the deputy minister, Hon. Mr. Ballantyne left the station at 9 o'clock for the first part of the inspection trip. The party proceeded in automobiles to West St. John, where a survey of the marine department wharf and depot was made. Thence they proceeded to the new government wharves at the southern end of the harbor and returned by way of the city wharves.

Returning via the ferry steamer, the party boarded the steamer Neptune at Walker's wharf to make a further inspection of the harbor. The Neptune steamed up the harbor, around the L. C. R. wharves and returning the party went to the water docks at Sand Point and then went around to Court-land wharf, where the minister was given an idea of the developments in progress.
