

England Coming to Senses In Matter of Dress and Dances

Pronounced Reaction Has Set In--The Tango Is Dead--Styles More Conservative

London, Feb. 20.—There are unmistakable signs of a reaction in London against "exotic" exaggeration and eccentricities in methods and manner, latterly injected into the social life of the British metropolis. Tango is already as dead as Queen Anne. It is true the Argentine dance still survives in such names as tango loco, where afternoon dancing is indulged in to the accompaniment of light refreshments and in the title of a revue being played at one of the principal vaudeville houses. "Hello Tango," stars one in the face in all theatrical advertisements, but on going to the show, one finds the tango dance ruthlessly cut out of the programme. At the chief restaurants where music is the feature and where only recently tango, ragtime and foxtrot were the bill, selections from Wagner, Grieg, Schubert and other high class composers are now being given nightly. At the Charity Ball given this week, which annually attracts a good muster of London society, only two tangoes figured on the programme, waltzes and Boston making up the other twenty numbers. The Che d'orchestre in a prominent west end theatre, says that patrons are now calling for selections from old favorites and he has had to discard all his newly purchased syncopated compositions. Gilbert and Sullivan's operas, Johann Strauss' waltzes, even selections from such operas as "The Bohemian Girl" and "The Mikado" are strong favorites. Daily Hints For the Cook

Gingerbread

To be eaten hot with whipped cream. To 1 cup of molasses add 1 teaspoonful of soda and beat until it becomes golden brown and foams. Add scant tablespoon of ginger, 1/2 teaspoon of salt, 1-3 cup melted shortening, 1 cup of milk and 3 cups of flour. Bake in slow oven with pan of water beneath.

Chocolate Custard

Beat the white of one egg stiff and drop it by spoonfuls into two cups of hot milk which you have in a pan on the fire. Remove them to a plate when they have puffed up by lifting each out with a fork. Beat the yolk of one egg, add 3-4 cups sugar, two even tablespoons cocoa and four even tablespoons cornstarch wet with a little cold water. Stir into the hot milk and cook until thick. Then add a small piece of butter size of nutmeg and teaspoon of vanilla. When cool put the custard in individual glasses and pile the white on top. This makes five.
