One Solution of Problem in States Suggested by Immigration Com-

Washington, Oct. 26—Commissioner-General of Immigration Keefe, in his annual report lays especial stress on Chinese immigration. The business of smuggling Chinese into this country has been growing steadily in spite of the efforts of the inspectors. Most of the Celestials are coming over the Canadian border. Owing to the length of the border, Mr. Keefe will report, it is impossible for agents to keep these activities within bounds.

Last year more than 8,000 Chinese lat ded in Canada. A great percentage of these have entered the United States. The ease with which Chinese can get into the United States from Canada has caused an increase of more than 100 per cent. in the number of immigrants who have entered the dominion within the last five years. Canadian statistics give 22,000 Chinese residents, although it is known that two or three times that number have entered the country in the last decade.




