MINUTES OF SYNOD, MONTREAL, JUNE 11TH, 1873. 49

CORRESPONDENTS TO THE MARITIME PROVINCES.

The Rev. Duncan Morrison, M.A., the Rev. Gavin Lang, the Rev. Duncan Macdonald, M.A., and the Rev. Walter Ross, M.A. were named Correspondents to the Synod of the Maritime Provinces in connection with the Church of Scotland; and the Clerk was instructed to grant Commissions to any other members of the Court who may desire to attend the ensuing meeting of that Synod.

DEPUTATION TO CHURCH OF SCOTLAND.

The Synod unanimously resolved to appoint, as they hereby do, the Rev. Gavin Lang, Minister of St. Andrew's Church, Montreal, and the Rev. William M. Black, Minister of St. Mark's Church in the same City, a Deputation to attend the next meeting of the Venerable the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland and to express the undiminished attachment cherished by this Church to the Parent Church.

DELEGATES TO THE UNITED STATES.

The Synod appointed the Rev. D. J. Macdonnell, the Rev. J. B. Muir and James Croil, Esq., a Deputation to attend the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America at its next annual meeting with instructions to reciprocate the brotherly greetings of the Delegate of that Assembly to this Synod and to express the interest with which they view the prosperity and extension of that large branch of the Presbyterian family of Churches.

COMMISSION OF SYNOD.

The Synod appointed their Commission to meet in St. Andrew's Church, Montreal, on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday of November next, at noon; in St. Andrew's Church, Toronto, on the Wednesday after the third Tuesday of January next, at noon; and oftener by adjournment when and where the Commission may choose.

Nine Commissioners shall be a quorum, of whom five must be Ministers. In all their actings the Commissioners shall proceed according to the Act of Synod, 1859, anent the nature, powers, and duties of the Commission of the Supreme Court of this Church.

VOTES OF THANKS.
