FIRST EDITION. THE SWIFT TEUTONIC.

UNPARALLELED SPEED OF THE WHITE STAR LINER.

3 Days, 16 Hours and 5 Minutes—Details of the Trip in Which she broke the Ocean Record and That for a Day's Run.

New York, Aug. 18.—The White Star line steamer Teutonic arrived at this port this morning with the distinction of having made the fastest ocean voyage on record.

This twice within a fortnight the steamer of the White Star line has broken the record, for the Teutonic's twin-sister ship, Majestic, made the best previous run when she arrived here on Aug. 5, in 5 days, 18 hours and 5 minutes.

She passed Dunn's Rock lightly of Queenstown Harbor at 2:05 p. m. last Thursday, and reached the Sandy Hook Lightship off the New York bar this morning at 1:30 o'clock.

Quarantine was reached at 6:05, and she was reached about an hour later. The knots logged each day were as follows: Thursday, 40; Friday, 40; Saturday, 50; Sunday, 60; Monday, 67; Tuesday, 70; total, 278. The average rate per hour was 23.16.

A remarkable feature of the trip is the three fast days of over 600 miles a day, the record of 617 miles for a day being the best ever made. The previous daily runs were 515 miles, made by the City of Paris.

It was quietly whispered before her passage was manifested among her passengers. After losing sight of the Irish coast, the Teutonic ran into a heavy fog, and it was impossible to render any assistance with her.

THAT CLOUD BURST. 21 Proves More Fatal Than Was Supposed.

Twenty-five bodies already recovered.

By TELEGRAPH TO THE GAZETTE. London, Aug. 21.—A cloudburst which partially deluged the village of Kilmannaghan, seems to have done more damage than was at first supposed.

500 bodies have already been recovered and about 1,000 are still missing. The bodies in rags, socks, etc., lying on the banks of the river, is stated that 6,000 cold metal rods have been hurled down the mountain a distance of 700 yards. Three hundred men are employed in the work.
