





Montreal Monday morning BATTLE LINE

Battle line Sellasis, Captain Abbott, sailed from New York, Nov. 3, for Civita Vacchia, Italy. SCHOONER PURCHASED.

The fore and aft schooner Douglas Adams, which recently arrived at Hillax from Lunenburg, has been purchased by Captain Pettipas of Newfoundland. PORTLAND SHIPPING.

In addition to the steamer Milipool, which will reach here Thursday from New York, two other boats under grain charter are nearly due, both coming gfrom the British Islams of St. Lucia in the West Indies, the Quarrydene having sailed on October 27, while the Brunswick left two days later. The British steamer Ingleby, 2313 tons, last reported at Genoa on October 18, is the latest tramp boat chartered to come here for grain, she being due for late November loading. Notwithstandings a full score of steamers are due to load grain here during the present month no congestion is likely to occur at the docks as the two Grand Trunk elevators will be able to handle them without the slightest difficulty. The bins at both houses are comfortably filled at the present time in spite of the heavy drafts which have been made on them the past week, and many car loads are arriving daily from the Canadian lake pots.—Portland Argus.
