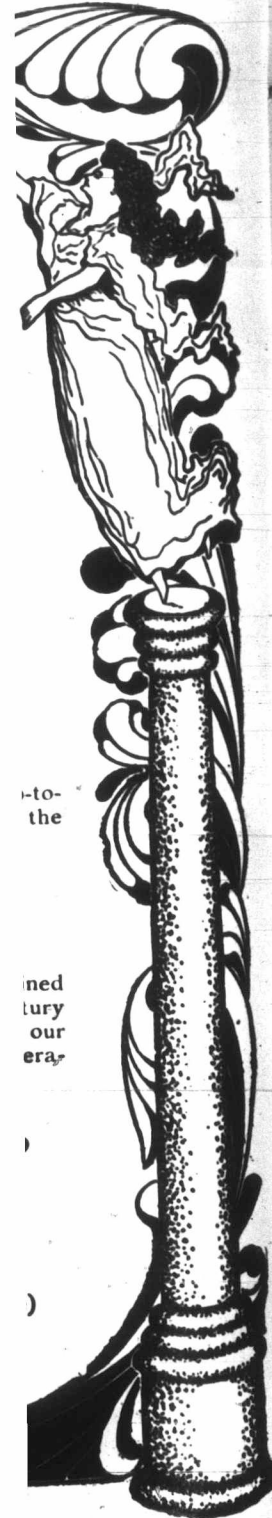

CRANES THAT HERD SHEEP.

The yakamik of South America is, so far as is known, the only "shepherd bird" anywhere. We have all known, of course, of dogs that, unaided, may be trusted to shepherd a flock of sheep, but a shepherd bird which will drive its charges to pasture, protect them from prowling animals at nightfall to bring them safely home again, is, indeed, a unique creature.

The native owners of sheep and poultry in Venezuela and British Guinea are the possessors of this species of crane—for to that family the yakamik belongs—to which are entrusted sheep, ducks, and other poultry. The South American sees them depart for their fielding grounds, secure in the knowledge that the crane will bring them all back safely. Any unlucky animal detected by the yakamik while prowling about to steal gets very much the worst of it. The bird savagely attacks the marauder with wing and beak, forcing it to retreat in haste. A dog is no match at all for the yakamik.
