Zaccheus, Burnham M.L.C. of Cobourg. B. in St. Thomas, 5 Feb. 1851. Ed. at St. Thomas and Galt Grammar Schools. M., 1876, Charlotte, dau. of Col. Hugh Richardson, Stipendiary Magistrate, N.W.T. Called to the Bar, Ont., 1873. Has been an Alderman of St. Thomas for some years. First refurned to Leg. Assem. at last g.e. A Conservative.—St. Thomas.

FELL, JOHN. (North Victoria.)

B. 21 Jan. 1819, at Baysdale, Ingleby Greenhow, Yorkshire, Eng., where his father was employed as a farmer. Ed. at the village sch., Ingleby. M., 1842, Jane Carling. Came to Can. in 1854 and settled in Cavan, Co. of Durham. Removed to Somerville, 1860. Is a farmer and saw and shingle mill owner. Was Reeve of Somerville for eighteen years and has been Warden of the Co. of Victoria for four years. An unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g.e. 1879. First returned to Leg.
