

Lafayette 18<sup>th</sup> April 1808

Sir,

Enclosed I have the honor to transmit, Statements of Indian Goods, imported at different Periods, for the use of the Indians residing in Upper & Lower Canada, which remain in His Majesty's Indian Stores here, this day, in the State & Condition as set forth.

The Superintendent General of Indian Affairs, having signified to me, his approbation, that I should apply for a Warrant to remove & condemn the above Goods: I am to request you will be so good as lay the enclosed Statements before the Governor in Chief, in order that His Excellency may give such instructions regarding them, as in his Wisdom, he may think proper.
