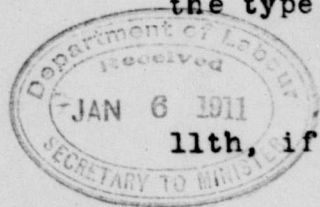
Hon. William L. MacKenzie King,

Dear Mr. King:
