Dear Dr. Bonar:

It is very kind of you to have expressed a favorable
opinion of the Colorado Plan. I value very much such an
expression coming from yourself. I am sure that the spirit
in which its several provisions are being administered is quite
equal to any merit in the provisions themselves, and I really
believe industrial good-will is being distinctly furthered in
the State of Colorado through this experiment. In case
you may not have seen the same, I am sending you a booklet
containing one or two addresses by Mr. Rockefeller, Jr. which
relate to the Plan, and which I think will be of interest to
you. I have had pleasure also in arranging to have copies
of this booklet sent Miss Toynbee and Aneurin Williams.

If you go to California, this summer, I should think
you would find it quite worth while to go via Denver. Pueblo
is a very short distance from there. The trip via Salt Lake
City and across Salt Lake itself to Francisco would, I think,
make the most interesting journey, unless, perchance, you
should desire to visit the Grand Canyon of Arizona, which you
