Peigan Boarding School


The average attendance at this school for the September quarter was 23.03 pupils, the per capita grant for which amounted to \$575.75. A deduction of \$123.28 was made from this amount. 1,490 lbs. of beef were supplied the school during July, August and September, last, amounting to \$89.40, also 35 sacks of flour supplied during the quarter amounting to \$63.88, leaving a balance of grant due of \$422.27.

For the June quarter, last, the average attendance was 19.94 pupils and the grant \$498.50. Deductions were made for 1,430 lbs. beef, \$85.80, also 20 sacks of flour, \$36.50; a total of \$122.30.

The deductions from the grant to this school for the above quarter were made from vouchers furnished and "certified correct" by the principal and the voucher furnished shows that the 20 sacks of flour were supplied the Peigan Boarding school in May last.

If you will be good enough to apply to the principals of these schools in future, it is thought that they should be able to supply you with full information as to the nature and amount of the supplies received by them each quarter and chargeable against the per capita grant to their school.
