Re: Leslie James Dougans

Copies of letters dated March 8th and 12th, 1947, addressed to the District Inspector, Air Regulations, Edmonton, by your Superintendent in Charge of "F" Division, in respect to the illegal flying done by Mr. Leslie James Dougans at Piapot, Saskatchewan, have been forwarded from our Edmonton office.

Mr. Dougans has finally been located at Camp 9, Bloedel Stewart & Welch, Port Alberni, B.C. He admits giving dual flying instruction to Mr. William Donn Coulter in Piper J3 CF-EMQ aircraft, and also states that his Limited Commercial Pilot's Certificate No. 3121 was destroyed by fire which occurred in the Barry Hotel at Prince Albert, Saskatchewan.

In view of the above, Mr. Dougans has been advised that a replacement of his Pilot's Certificate, should he desire one, will not be made for an indefinite period. Mr. Coulter, the owner of the aircraft, has been warned that any future infractions of Air Regulations 1938 will be dealt with more severely.

No further action against these gentlemen is contemplated at this time, and I desire to express my thanks for the assistance rendered by your Regina Detachment in trying to locate Mr. Dougans.
