

A SKETCH  
OF THE  
COUNTY OF HALTON,  
CANADA WEST.

The County of Halton is bounded on the North by the County of Wellington, on the East of the County of Peel, on the South by Lake Ontario, and on the West by the County of Wentworth and the Township of Puslinch, in the County of Waterloo. It contains 229,555 acres, and in 1861, its assessed value was \$6,702,993, with a population of about 22,794. County Town—Milton, the assessed value of which in 1861 was \$150,000, with a population of about 1,000. Halton has four Townships, which are as follows :—Trafalgar, Nelson, Esquensing and Nasgaweya.

**TRAFALGAR.**

Trafalgar contains about 68,613 acres, and is bounded on the North by the Township of Esquensing, on the East by the Township of Toronto, in the County of Peel, on the South by Lake Ontario, and on the West by the Township of Nelson.
