

#### FIELD MARSHAL OYAMA

JAPANESE WARRIOR LONGS FOR QUIETUDE AND PEACE.

Strongly and Heavily Built and More Powerful Looking Than the Average Japanese-Knows He is Homely and Jests About His Looks - But the Great Military Man Does Not Love

Field Marshal Oyama is by no means Field Marshal Oyama is by no means a man of prepossessing aspect, but since pictures were taken of him at the outbreak of the war with Russia he has grown a beard, which partially covers the pockmarks in his face and adds something to his martial air. The photograph reproduced herewith was taken recently and gives a good idea of his appearance in the field supervising the movements of the armies which are driving the Russians back toward St. Petersburg. He is strongly and heavily built and more powerful looking than the average Japanese. He knows

Though so great a man in the military affairs of his country, Marshal Oyama does not love war. He once said: "My idea of happiness is to dispose of everything I possess that belongs to the practice of arms and go far into the country with hig boxes of books to read for the rest of my days—books that tell of happiness and progress and not of the terrible deeds of war. And I would gather about me my best old friends and little children. Than in the sunny days all would be happiness."

Though not gifted with a handsome face himself, the bronzed and scarred veteran of several wars has an eye for beauty in the fair sex. The late Lafcadio Hearn related that while Oyams was a judge advocate in Tokio he attended a ball one night and was standing near a doorway when a heavild-

tended a ball one night and was standing near a doorway when a beautiful European woman swept by. So greatly did her charm impress the soldier judge that he exclaimed involuntarily:

"What a levely woman!"

Overhearing the remark, the lady looked back over her shoulder and, recognizing the speaker, replied, "What an excellent judge!"

Some Fine Cut Facts.

This corps of nurses are all women of good social position, and have to undergo three years' training in a general hospital before qualifying.

Emblem of the Red Cross.

The selection of the emblem of the Red Cross Society was a compliment to Switzerland, which country had anyounced her interest in humanity by officially issuing invitations to the vations of the world to meet in conference and establish rules for the government of civilised communities when engaged in warfare. The national flag of Switzerland is a white Greek cross on a red ground, and the colors of the Red Cross flag were simply reversed. By the terms of the Red Cross treaty the hospital flag of every nation must be a red Greek cross, on a white ground, and every person, ambulance, or other essential of the service must be so designated.

Healthiest City in Europe.
The population of Rome, Italy, on December 31, 1904, was 506,840. The census statistics show that the Eternal City is the healthiest town in Europe. The death rate at present is 18.3, a very low percentage compared with their large centres. In 1876 the death rate was 30 per 1,000. In 1885 it had fallen to 26. The city it not naturally favorable to health, but it is now regarded as one of the healthlest cities in the world, owing to modern sanitation.

NAMES OF EXPRESS TRAINS. Terse Terms That Impress Them-selves Upon the Public.

Some time ago a railroad company offered a substantial prize for the most attractive title for its fastest train, and though none of those submitted was accepted the ingenuity of the competi-tors was not undeserving of praise. Among those sent in were such titles as the Republican limited, the Narrow Path express, the Liberty express, the Yankee High Flier and many others more or less good, says the Detroit News-Tribune. Although the novel competition practically failed in its purpose, it called attention to the picturesque and ingenious names which designate many of the important high fliers which run daily over American rails. There is no better known express in the world than the Twentieth Century limited, which runs with but a single stop between New York and Chicago in twenty hours. The title in this instance is a particularly happy one, for it not only symbolizes the century in which we live, but also the actual time occu-pied in the run.

Another interesting and appropriate

name belongs to an express which runs daily from Philadelphia to New York and which is known as the Brides' limited. This high flier gained its name from the fact that ever since its inauguration last year it has not failed to carry at least one happy couple on a honeymoon trip daily. The Brides' limthed is made up of three or four Pullman coaches, each bearing some title suggestive of its happy freight, such as Cupid, Hymen, etc., and the train is now extremely popular with newly married couples

The Green Mountain Flier is the famous Montreal express for New York and received its name from the beautiful green hills through which it runs on its daily journeys. An equally pic-turesque title is that of the Sunset Limited, a Southern Pacific express, which dashes daily toward that El Do-rado of horticulturists—California.

Minneapolis and St. Paul are known as the Twin Cities, and so it is only natural that the train which runs from there to St. Louis should be called the Twin City Limited. The exposition at St. Louis, by the way, has been the means of giving titles to many new trains, among these being the Exposi-tion Limited, over the Grand Central.

One of the most magnificent trains in the world is the High Grass Limited, which runs from St. Paul to the Pacific coast, so called because in its journey it passes over much desolate prairie. This train is one of the longest for passensisting, as it does, of thirteen cars, each averaging eighty feet in length.
