

## WELLESLEY.

(Formerly Smithville.)

A post village in the township of Wellesley and on the River Nith—17 miles from Berlin and 79 miles from Toronto. The village was first settled in 1847, by John Smith after whom the village was called until 1852. The facilities for manufacturing purposes are the river Nith, and two streams, tributaries of the same river. The post office was established in 1851 and William Brown appointed postmaster, the present postmaster is John Zoeger; the village contains two stores, one flouring mill carried on by Lawrence Doering, having three run of stone and will manufacture about 60 bbls. of flour per day; one saw mill sawing about a quarter of a million feet per annum; three waggon shops; two boot and shoe shops; a fine hotel, and new hall in connection, called the Wellesley Hotel, and two others; two churches, German Lutheran, erected in 1854 at a cost of twelve hundred dollars, of frame, and the New Jerusalem church, erected in 1858, of frame, at a cost of four hundred dollars. There is a good school with an average attendance of 78 pupils under the charge of John Klein. Mails daily.
