The Team having proceeded to England a week earlier this year, in order to afford ample time for practice at the Altear Rifle Ranges near Liverpool, the cost of the expedition is consequently in excess of last year, the time spent at Altear being ten days, necessitating additional expense for subsistence and ammunition, whilst at Wimbledon the entrance fees were almost double as compared with last year.

An extra allowance of one shilling per diem was paid to the members of the Team for subsistence in camp at Wimbledon. This increase was found to be necessary for the comfort of the Team.
