

Ste-Anne College

Establishment : This institution was founded in 1890, by Rev. Gustave Blanche and other Fathers of the Congregation of Jesus and Mary, commonly called Eudists. The first building occupied by the students was the Glebe House until the 4th of November, 1891, when the present commodious structure, 110 ft. by 60 ft., was opened to boarders and half-boarders

On the 30th of April, 1892, Ste-Anne College was incorporated and chartered "as a University with all and every, the usual privileges of such an institution," and the Directors of said corporation then or hereafter appointed, were entrusted with the power and privilege of "conferring the degrees of Bachelor, Master and Doctor in the several Arts and Faculties, and of making such by laws and regulations as they may deem necessary to govern the granting of such degrees, and determine the scholastic requirements therefor."

Situation : Ste Anne College, located near St. Mary's Bay, occupies the most beautiful site in the district of Clare, and commands an extensive view of its villages and of the Bay. The air is pure and invigorating, and for health the position cannot be excelled in Canada.

Object : To awaken and develop the intelligence, to form the heart, the character and the conscience ; to make good citizens as well as good christians, such is the end which the Directors will ever strive to attain in their teaching. In order to arrive at this happy result no pains will be spared. A paternal and constant surveillance, a discipline at once firm
