HANDWORK

To make a booklet of the story of David, take two oblong pieces of heavy paper (not white), fold each one once to make two leaves, and tie them into a book of four pages. On the outside paste a picture of David as a shepherd boy.

As you have each new story about David, make a "scissors picture" of it to paste in your book. The first eight lessons of the quarter are the lessons you will tell about on your six pages, and if you put Lessons IV and V on one page, and Lessons VII and VIII on one page, you will have just enough. Try to cut out your pictures free hand—that is, without drawing any lines to follow. Cut them out of white paper.

Write under each lesson picture the golden text or a memory verse.

Make the crown and the Ark of gold paper if you can.

(If your teacher will go to the printing office, she may be able to get pieces of left-over book paper which the printer would throw away and which will make beautiful books for the whole class.)
