During a call at the Northey Mfg. Co.'s plant at Toronto, on King St. West, at the subway, we were shown through a complete establishment, and were informed that the demand for this class of power is increasing very rapidly. The firm is building engines of all power up to 12 horse, especially adapted for farm use, as well as an engine especially designed for pleasure launches. Every detail has been carefully considered in their construction, and one would imagine that the highest point of perfection had been attained, and every provision for safety. We were surprised when we were informed that the actual cost of running amounted only to 14c. per hour per horse power, and with such a power bolted to a movable platform (stone boat) the work on a farm, such as grinding, cutting, pumping, wood sawing, separating milk, and churning, can be done with comparatively little help. The Jersey cow, Adelaide of St. Lambert 73652, illustrated on another page in this issue, has made her mark for milk production higher than that of any other cow of the breed on record, having given a milk yield of 2,005½ bs. in thirty-one days, an average per day for thirty-one days of 64.85-124 bs., and 75½ bs. in thirty-one days of 64.85-124 bs., and 75½ bs. in a single day for her present owners. Mesers. Miller & Sibley, Franklin, Pa. Mr. Henry Harrison, of Cannington, Ont., who owned the cow last year, has made the affirmation that she gave for him in May, 1897, 82½ bs. in one day, and that there was only twenty-four hours time included in this yield. Adelaide of St. Lambert is eighty-ears old. She was calved the property of and raised by Capt. William Rolph, of Markham, Ontario, who sold her, bought her back, and again sold her to Mesers. Miller & Sibley last winter. She was sired by Comely's Steke Pogis 19327, and her dam was Princess Minette 24042, who has a record of 18 lbs. % ozs. butter in seven days, and is a granddaughter of Stoke Pogis 3rd. Adelaide of St. Lambert has not been tested for butter, but Miller & Sibley state that her butter, but Miller & sibley strong cow, but by no means havdsome, and has a very capacious barrel, as well as a very capacious udder. 
