CALCUTTA, May 19.—The report that from 20,000 to 30,000 persons died from cholera while returning from a religious fair is repeated.

Gangs of malcontents at Poona have written to the Bombay Government threatening to rise another mutiny and put a price upon the head of the Governor.

The cholera in Peshawar is threatening to rise an obstacle to the withdrawal of troops from Afghanistan for some time. Bands are scouring the country, committing daring attacks on houses and villages. They seem to form a part of a regular organization, under the command of one Wassander Bulmend, lately a clerk in the Financial Department.
