An account of the warrants issued for the payment of the several sums granted in the last session was laid before the House by command of his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor.

Read the third time as engrossed.

Bill read

“ *A Bill to declare that no Law passed in the General Assembly of the Province of Nova-Scotia before the Erection of the Province of New-Brunswick shall be of force in this Province.*”

and sent up.

Ordered, That the said bill pass and be sent up for concurrence.

Read the third time.

Bill read

“ *A Bill for the Recovery of small Debts.*” as reported by the committee of the whole House yesterday.

Which was agreed to—and Ordered, To be engrossed.

Went again into the consideration of “ *A Bill for fixing permanently the Boundary Lines between the different Grants in this Province.*”

Report of the committee.

The chairman reported that the committee had gone through the said bill and agreed to the same with amendments.

And the said bill, being read, was agreed to, as amended, and Ordered, To be engrossed.—

Report of Mr. R. Pagan.

Mr. Robert Pagan made a report of the expenditure of a part of the money granted in the last session for opening the road from Fredericton to Saint Andrews, the state of the said road, and the sum requisite to complete the same—
