GREEKS REPORT A WIN
Turks Came Over the Tables But Were Driven Out
Greek General Headquarters in Asia Minor, Sept. 7—Turkish Nationalist forces have been driven from the new positions they occupied on Sept. 1, but have retired slowly defending every inch of the ground. On Tuesday night the Turks launched wild attacks and succeeded temporarily in re-occupying their lost position, but later were again driven out.
Unofficial estimates place the Turkish losses at 12,000 killed and wounded. The Greek losses are unknown but are said to be heavy.
