#### NEWFOUNDLAND'S CONTRIBUTIONS

Montreal, Dec. 16.—Newfoundland has given over 2,000 men to Great Britain for war service, said F. J. Jackman at a meeting of the Newfoundland Society last night in its rooms in the St. George's Society Building. The Colony started by sending 112 men to help Wolfe at Quebec, and had rendered many a faithful service since. Most of the Newfoundlanders now with the colors were Naval Reserve men, while 600 were at Salisbury Plain.

E. W. Mudge, Vice-President of the Society, referred to the 30 Newfoundlanders who left Montreal with the first contingent, and completed arrangements to send them tobacco and other comforts. W. C. Gaden was Chairman. Lieut.-Col. E. M. Renour, Dr. C. A. Peters, and F. Collins were among those present.
