Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may home-stead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (out not Sub-Agency,) on certain conditions.

Certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine niles of his homestead or a farm of et least 80 acres, on certain conditions.

A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
