**INCREASE TEACHERS' PAY**

St. Thomas, Feb. 27.—The Board of Education has adopted a new schedule for Collegiate Institute teachers. The Principal receives an increase from \$1,650 to \$1,800; heads of departments, from \$1,200 to \$1,400; assistant specialists, from \$900 to \$1,100; assistants, from \$800 to \$1,000. Male principals of Public schools get an increase from \$1,100 to \$1,200; first assistants, \$59 a year, and lady principals, \$25. The motion to increase all salary teachers \$75 a year was voted down. The Board will ask the Council for \$37,000 for the year, \$3,000 in excess of last year, but one school will be remodelled at a cost of \$2,350. A motion declaring want of confidence in Principal Quance of the Collegiate was made by Trustees Rev. H. W. Reade and A. W. Graham, but was voted down.
