

Japan Agrees to Further Restrict it to United States.

Tokio, Feb. 19.-The memorandum of the Japanese Government in reply to that of the United States on the subint of the United States on the sub-ject of emigration, mentioned yesterday by the Associated Press, was handed to Ambassador O'Brien to-day. It is under-stood that it agrees in general terms with a number of suggestions made by the American Government and requires

the American Government and requires a further restriction of emigration by the practical prohibition of laborers. The Japanese Government pointed out that the restrictions already enforced, including the closing of emigration to Canada, Mexico and the Hawaian 1s-lands, will make further complaints from America almost impossible.







GREAT STORM.


