

PRETTY GIRL WAS DROWNED.

Body Taken From Tuscarawas River at Canal Dover, O.

She Was Called to 'Phone and Left Her Home.

Relatives Claim Foul Play—Coroner Finds No Bruises on Body.

Canal Dover, O., Sept. 17.—Police are searching to-day for an unidentified girl who Miss Florence Weber, a pretty twenty-year-old girl, whose body was found in the Tuscarawas River to-day.

Until last night relatives of the girl believed she left the vicinity of her uncle's home alone. Mrs. Catherine Keulerber, however, informed the police that she saw the girl meet soon after Miss Weber left the house.

Mrs. Keulerber also told the police that she believes the Weber girl had been morose for many days. On Sept. 5, she says, she went to the Maple Grove cemetery and found Miss Weber there.

The story of R. J. Collier, to the effect that he saw a man and a woman quarrelling on a bridge, Monday night, near the spot where the girl's body was found, has caused the police to institute a search for the unidentified man.

The theory that Miss Weber committed suicide was strengthened last night, when Coroner Romig reported that there were no bruises on the girl's body.

FEW DIVORCES IN CANADA.

A Grand Total in Forty Years of 136 in the Dominion.

There is a surprising difference between the divorce statistics of the United States and those of Canada.

While in that country divorces are granted by the thousand, on this side of the boundary the number rarely reaches even two figures annually.

Since 1867 there has been a grand total of 136 divorces granted in Canada.

The figures are given in detail in the St. John Globe as follows:

In 1867-68, one was granted; in '69, one; '70, '71 and '72, none; '73, one; '74, one; '75, four; '76, three; '77, one; '78, one; '79, one; '80, one; '81, one; '82, one; '83, one; '84, one; '85, one; '86, one; '87, one; '88, one; '89, one; '90, two; '91, one; '92, one; '93, one; '94, one; '95, one; '96, one; '97, one; '98, three; '99, four; 1900, five; '01, two; '02, two; '03, seven; '04, six.

In 1905 nine were granted; in 1906, fourteen; 1907, five; 1908, eight, while the first season eclipsed all records with a total of sixteen.
