It is not probable that the New Brunswick
Government will follow the example
of that of Nova Scotia. It does not pro-
pose to be a Tory, or even a Liberal-Conservative
Government, but some sort of
hybrid, and it seems to imagine that the
most that can be expected of it is some
sort of reformation—as small as may be.
There is no room to doubt that the
constituencies expected that a majority
of the men they elected would oppose
this Government. Indeed so thoroughly
was this supposed to be understood in
some points that no pledges or promises
on that count were asked or given, and
unless some of them are willing to be ranked
with the most contemptible of those
whom the people rejected at the late
elections because when in the Legislature
they supported this Government, a large
support will not be forthcoming in this
election. It is not probable that the
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
