Disaster at Sea.

AN ENGLISH BARQUE SUNK-ALL ON BOARD LOST BUT THREE.

New York, Aug. 18.—The Captain of the steamship Alabama, from Glasgow, And soon in your bosom the weeper will which arrived to night, reports the sinking of the barque Abeona, of Liverpool, from Montreal for Glasgow, as follows:-Friends of my youth I have witnessed your August 4, at 11.50 p.m., Instrachall light bearing east by south 15 miles, wind Shades of the dead I have wept at your northwest, sky cloudy, the ship steering west-northwest, making about eight knots on the port bow; shortly after saw a red. stopped the engines; directly saw a Friends of my youth, you are hastening barque heading up apparently about north northeast, crossing our bows; reversed the engines full speed, notwith. standing which she came directly into us, striking us a little on the port bow and a little about the barque's forerigging; the time from the collision till the barque sank could not have been more than five ered the quarter-boats to search for survivors and threw overboard buoys and ropes. One man swimming close to the ship cought a life buoy and was picked up by one of the boats. Another drifted alongside on a part of the wreck and was Stars, ye are thick in the pathway of light, from the barque's boat which was full of water. The boats continued in the immediate vicinity of the wreck for two and half hours, but could discover no further traces of the crew. With some difficulty succeeded in getting one boat up, Buds of the spring, ye are blasted and but in hoisting up the other it got stove and was lost, but saved the men. Remained in the immediate vicinity of the wreck, steaming slowly round until four o'clock on the morning of the 5th, when it being daylight and clear, nothing further of the wreck was in sight.
