UNDERGOES GRUELING CROSS-EXAMINATION BY INSURGENT'S COUNSEL
Cornwall Maintains He Has Interest in the Alberta and Great Waterways Railway

Cornwall Will Be Re-Examined Monday by Either McKenzie or Woods—Witness Gives Evidence on Testimony of Spectators by His Brilliant Sakes With R. B. Bennett—Material Brought Out in Admittance of Evidence Secured by Walsh in His Direct Examination

After two and a half days of examination and cross-examination before the Royal Commission, J. K. Cornwall stepped from the witness box after noon today. The ordeal of the northern railway incorporator went was one of the most severe he has ever known.
