NEGROES FOR B.C.

Five Thousand Will Be in Coast Province Before End of Summer Says Colonel T. J. Harris, Now Visiting in Vancouver.

Vancouver, April 27.—"All right! Five thousand diggers into British-American soil before the summer goes, says Colonel T. J. Harris, of Sappulpa, Okla. He has just returned from a tour of the coast province, and he has a number of hands on in Alberta, British Columbia or Saskatchewan."

Born in old Kentucky of parents who owned slaves, Col. Tom Harris is heading a movement of negroes from the Southern States to the Canadian West, and he left the city for Calgary and Edmonton in the hope of securing wild prairie lands for negro colonization purposes.

Harris is a picturesque character. He wears a soft felt, wide brimmed hat and a flowing black tie bowed about a linen collar of the type that is common in the Southern States. The colonel's hair is almost white. He wears it long, and this with a grizzled mustache and goatee adds much to the outward dressing of a down-south personality.

At the Dunsmuir hotel Col. Harris declared that there has been a negro invasion of Canada that will develop in the months to come. He said that he had been dealing in Canadian prairie lands for some time. Already he had prepared the way for the coming into the country west of Edmonton for many negro families among them many from Oklahoma and other sections in the Middle South were anxious to come to Canada to go on the land.

Asked if he had any connection with the party of negroes who have been held from entering British Columbia, the southerner denies knowing anything of these immigrants. He said that he had no connection with any government but that he had a black man if the black bore a good clean reputation and was self-supporting.

"Of course," said the colonel in his peculiar, drawling way, "I am not in favor of colored immigrants. I'll make it my business to locate settlers in Alberta, and if those who wish to settle on them are black, all right. I expect that my syndicate will place several hundred blacks in Canada this summer."

"But the bringing of blacks into Canada will develop a racial question here such as you have in the United States," one of the newspapermen suggested.

"Who started it?" shot the colonel. "It was the British who first brought slaves into the South and the British would be held responsible to a large degree for the outcome of the traffic there."
