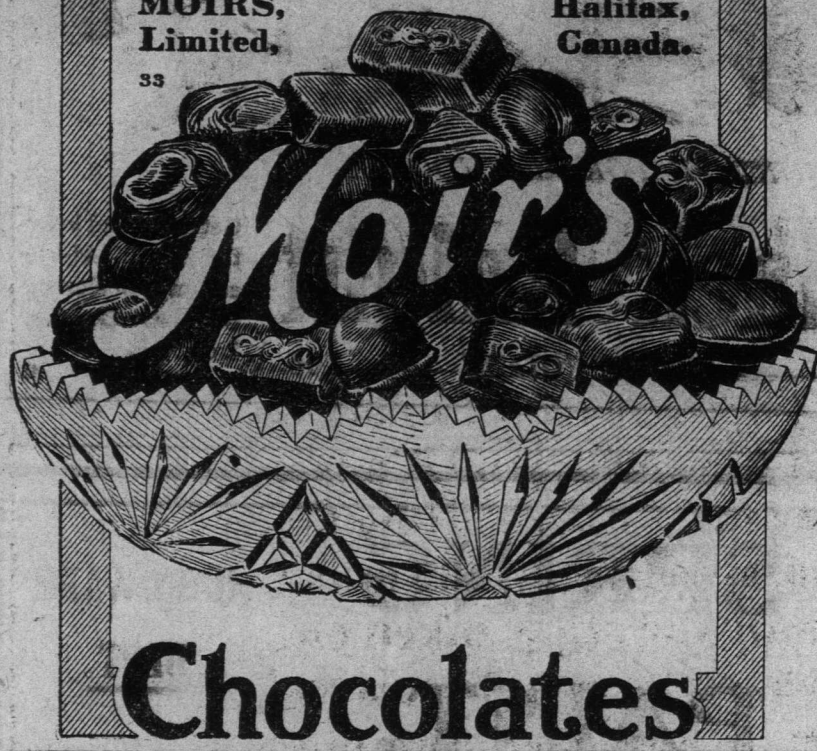

Pacifists will also have something to say, and the absence of any response to Germany's offer of 16 keels to 10, and Churchill's silence on this point, are certain to be keenly criticized in ministerial circles. Here are two characteristic comments: Lord Beresford, referring to the proposed reduction of £3,000,000, said it could not be achieved without some sacrifice of naval strength, which might be urgently needed at the shortest notice. It appeared to him to be gambling with the very life of the Empire. OSTEND, March 14.
