

Distressed

Rescued by S. S. Prospero-The Vessel is -as. R. Bradley, Which Dr Cook had on his Expedition to Nort Polar Regions.

On Saturday a message was received in the city as referred to in the Telegram, that an unknown schoone was in the ice off St. Mary's and fix ing distress signals. On being in formed Mr. J. Munn, with typica promptness, communicated with th S.S. Prospero, which was then a arystown, ordering her to the assist ance of the reported distressed schi The Coastal steamer was successful in her mission and, according to a message received to-day by Mr. Munn and disabled condition, being anchored and jammed in the ice about two miles from the shore. The schoone proved to be the James R. Bradley and had all her sails blown awa while the crew had no water to drink She was then taken in tow and brought to Burin, where she is now lying at anchor. The James R. Bradley was owned by the Gordon Pew Company, and was eighteen days out from Gloucester with a load of frozen squid for St. Pierre. This is the same vessel that took the famous Dr. Cook on his expedition to the North Polar Regions. We understand that it was the intention of Mr. Emanuel Pike, of the West Coast, to charter to the Gulf sealfishery this spring.

Transcontinental Scandal.

The Commissioners appointed by the Borden Government to investigate the cost of building the Transcontin ental find that the cost will be \$234. 651,521, as against the \$61,415,000 es-timated by Hon. W. S. Fielding, the Minister of Finance at the time it was ndertaken. It is alleged that \$40 .-000,000 were squandered. When the bill was introduced Sir Wilfred Laurier estimated that the obligation on the overnment would be simply seven years interest or \$12,000,000 or \$13, 000,000 and not a cent more.


