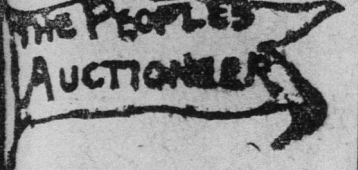

In a letter to C. R. Wagner, who dis-
