Never allow milk to remain uncovered. Tube pans are an economy in cake baking. Wood ashes makes a good polish for tinware. Every room should have a thermometer in it. 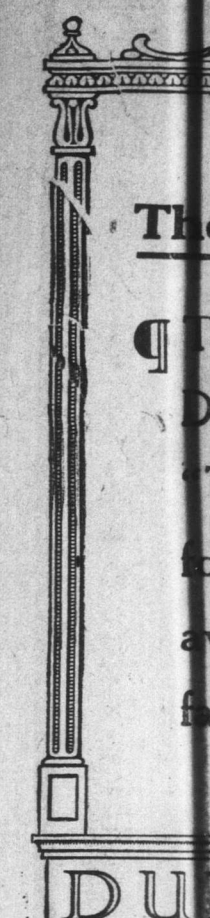
