WEEKLY MEETING.
The weekly meeting of the Municipal Council was held yesterday afternoon. Mayor Cook presided and Messrs. Martin, Outebridge, Vincent, Collier, Ryan and Dowden were present.

The usual preliminaries of the meeting were read from the minutes. A. E. Hickman & Co., Ltd., of St. John's, offering to supply road oil for the coming season. The matter was referred to stand over.

Applications were read from Chas. Werby, J. Dillon and J. Power, for the position of driver of the city's motor truck. Same were referred to stand over.

A gentleman called attention to the fact of having a light placed in front of his residence, Duck-Street East. This matter was referred to the Lighting Committee.

A petition was read from the residents of Waterford Bridge Road, requesting the placing of a road and the making repairs to the road. The matter was referred to the Engineer.

A letter from E. G. Consens of land on Southside Road for use as a playground will be given consideration by the Engineer and Road Committee.

Imperial Tobacco Co. and Mitchell & Son, Ltd., asked permission to erect advertising signs on property of private individuals and the latter on vacant land near the Railway Station and on the property, Water Street East.

The Engineer decided to refer the matter to the Engineer and Road Committee for their consideration. After the meeting will be given applications.

Mr. William Hearn to Quarry Spawls, as per specification, was accepted, as also that of Messrs. H. & Co. to supply hose.

Applications for Lead Pipe were opened and consideration of same was deferred.

In connection with the application of Messrs. Macklin to make alterations to the building, Macklin Place, the Mayor was asked to visit the site and report.

A. St. John, Medical Officer of Health reported on several cases of Scarlet fever and one of Diphtheria in the city during the past week.

A petition was called to the fact that many streets in the city were in a state of disrepair and that many old poles which have been cut down are projecting from the level of the street, much to the inconvenience and danger of the public.

It was ordered that the City Engineer be immediately removed from the question, and also that the City Engineer be asked to give attention to the cutting down of the poles throughout the city during the next season.

Reports of the City Engineer, Superintendent of Sanitary Work and the various departments were read and approved.

The meeting adjourned.
