THE GENERAL'S SEIZURE.

Cavid Mills' Opinion on Action of General Middleton.

the question asked Hon. David Mills yearterday.

"Yss, I reed it to day."

"Do you think General Middleton was
unfairly dealt with by Parliament?"

"No; I think that Parliament dealt
with General Middleton with great
generosity. He requived from Parliament for his services in the Northwest
a very large sum of money, in addition
to his salary as the head of the military
forces in this country. He was sent
there for the purpose of suppressing the
rebellion, which had not attained such proportions as to close the courts of justice,
and suppend the operations of the law."

"Was General Middleton in your estimation, justified in seizing Beemner's furs,
with a view to their confiscation to the
Grown."

"Was General Middleton, in your estimation, justified in seizing Bremner's furs, with a view to their confiscation to the Crows?"
"No; he had no sight to seize them at all. They were not furs taken from the snemy in the field. His duty was to protect property, not to confiscate it; and the sight law being in force the Government could have no authority whatever to order General Middleton to seize the property of Mr. Bremner or any other citizen of the Northwest. Had Bremner been convicted of treason, then the rights of the Crown in respect to his property would have been just precisely what they are in the case of any other party convicted of a similar offense; but as Bremner was never convicted, his property was as much under the protection of the law as yours."

"Was Mr. Hayter Reed specially cereposible for the sondust of General Middleton in seizing the furs? The Globe correspondent says that Hayter Reed was appointed by the Government as the legal adviser of General Middleton."

"Made not think that that statement will prove to be correct, but it does not in the slightest degree selley General Middleton, though it treet; dees implicate the fibershire; and when he proved to be such they were in duty bound prompely to inquire into his conduct. General Middleton, among the fursy body else, to do what he did. In saying this much, I do not in any degree condone the offense of Mr. Bedson or Mr. Hayter Reed. They, like Gen. Middleton, appropriated to another citizen, and their conduct should have been long ago inventigated by the Administration. When Parliament finds it necessary to institute inquiry into almost of this. kind, it is very clear that the Administration have been negligent. Had Ministers done their duty, Mr. Bedson and Mr. Reed, would long ago have been called to account for their part in this transaction. The law is intended to be a terror to evildoer, but as administered by General Middleton and these two gentlemen it has been made un instrument of oppression and injustice worthy of a Turkish pash
