THE CANADIAN HORSE SHOW.

Toronto, April 16.—The Canadian

Horse Show was opened in the Armories

at 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon by the

Governor-General and Lieutenant-

Governor Kirkpatrick. The opening

was witnessed by large crowds, in

which was included the elite of To-

ronto society, while the attendance was

swelled by those who came in from out-

side Ontario towns, and by many vi-

sitors from the United States. There

are about seven hundred entries, in

which are included the highest class

horses from all parts of the Dominion.

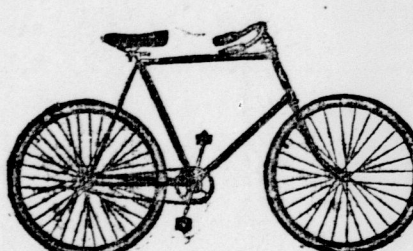
