

LANE INSISTS CANCER IS CASE FOR SURGEON ONLY

Eminent Britisher, Visiting London, Comments on Proposal to Use Lead Specific.

PEOPLE LIVE WRONG

Eat Naturally and Exercise and Eliminate the Hospitals, He Says.

Sir William Arbuthnot Lane, world-famous British surgeon, arrived in London at 1:15 today from Detroit, to address a meeting of the Western Ontario medical academy at the medical school this afternoon, and a meeting of the Canadian Club at the Teunish house this evening.

He was accompanied from Detroit by Dr. George A. Ramsay, who journeyed to that city to meet him. At the C. P. R. station the distinguished visitor was met by General Kings Dr. A. J. Grant and Prof. Fred Landon of the university of Western Ontario.

If Sir Arbuthnot is a big man in the medical world, he is not less so in the physical realm. He appeared to be well over six feet in height and is heavily built. He speaks and moves with a precision and energy which would almost at once betray his profession.

Not First Visit. His appearance is just about what would expect in a distinguished surgeon. In response to questions, Sir Arbuthnot stated that this is by no means his first visit to Canada. He has crossed to America ten times and recalls with much pleasure a visit he paid to Toronto in 1918, during which he was presented with a large Canadian flag by the mayor of that city. "I still have it at home in my library," he stated.

His chief purpose in coming to America on this occasion was to deliver the John D. Murphy oration at the Philadelphia meeting of the American college of surgeons. His remarks on the subject of medical education on this occasion were so revolutionary as to cause quite a furore.

In talking with The Advertiser today, Sir Arbuthnot repeated his contention that medical education is on a more or less wrong basis. He lays great stress on the fact that to quote his own words, "there's no such thing as curing diseases such as cancer, rheumatism, arthritis and others. The best we can do is to alleviate them. What we can do is prevent them altogether, by teaching correct habits of living, and by believing in time we can do without hospitals, if people will only follow natural ways of living."

How to Fight Disease. "Civilization has produced many diseases unknown to primitive races living in their natural environment," he pointed out. "But there is convincing evidence that if men will eat natural food, adopt correct habits, and take sufficient exercise, the disease of civilization can be kept at bay."

Asked for an opinion on the recent announcement of Prof. Bell that lead was a specific for cancer, he replied in characteristic fashion, "Keep your organs healthy and you won't have cancer." "Yes, but many have got it already," the reporter replied. "What can be done about it?" "It is a case for a surgeon always," he replied, indicating that he placed little faith in so-called cancer cures developed to date.

Touching on the relation of diet to cancer, Sir Arbuthnot revealed a happy aptitude for epigram. He had been advising the use of whole-wheat bread in preference to white bread. "I have always said I believe it that the whiter the bread the sooner you're dead," was his reply.

A nation's health. A similar opinion drives the slogan of the new health society which he has founded in England. "A nation's health is a nation's wealth."

Three former premiers of England are interested in the activities of this society, ex-Premier Asquith, now the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Oxford and Asquith, David Lloyd George, and Ramsay MacDonald.

"I got them interested because I believe that a nation's health should be the first concern of our political leaders," he stated.

The object of the society, among other things, is to teach the advantages of right food, fresh air, sunshine and exercise, through the medium of newspapers, pamphlets, books, wireless and lectures.

The famous surgeon blames incivility feeding and faulty methods of living for the ill-health of the civilized world. His cry is "back to natural foods."

ANNOUNCES DISCOVERY THAT MINERALS HAVE SEXES

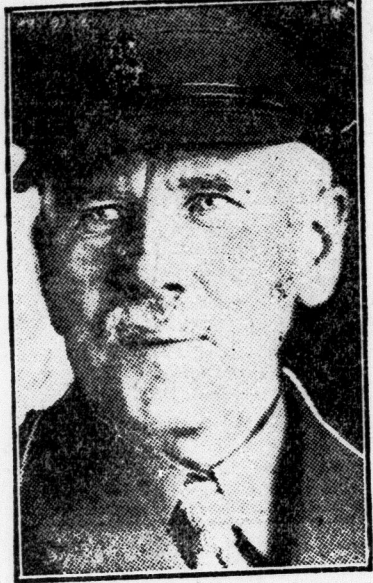
Dr. Manuevoff declares that extended investigations into the atomic characteristics of minerals show the same masculine and feminine characteristics as those of vegetable and animal cells.

BRIBERY IS HEARD AGAINST M'BRIDE

W. G. Brown Charges M.L.A. Mayor of Brantford Accepted \$50.
