TAKE OVER TIP TOP MINE.

Bondholders Are Satisfied With Property and Exercise Rights.

Greenwood, B.C., May 21.—A few months ago the Tip Top, east of town, was bonded by a local syndicate at a figure reported to be \$10,000.
