

It is estimated at one-half to three quartors of last year's crop. The July wheat squeeze is over at St. Louis, and that market was weak to-day in consequence of heavy deliveries on August contracts.

R. Cochran's correspondents: Exports small and forward, engagements light, but a great deal of wheat is going east and it may be set affoat later for Europe. The bears on corn have had about everything to favor them, but in spite of this the market has shown much strength and looks like going higher. Oats sympathize some, but are slow and inactive. Pork has been firm with fair demand. The stock of old pork is almost exhausted and the supply of regular is moderate. The poor quality of hogs received indicates preity close marketing. Ribs and lard offered more freely, but the general market is encouarging for holders.

John J. Dixon & Co. correspondents: In spite of action on the Hatch Bill in the Senate Satured ay there was no apparent increase here in the outside speculative interest. This was a disappointment, yet prices were firm. The firmness was unquestionably due to the Senate's action, it being argued that it was not remarkable that the outsider was not in the market on the very first day after the favorable action. Large receipts, favorable crop reports and small clearances were more than offset by the hopefulness which the Senate's action created. The increase in the visible supply was about half what the trade was expecting. 
