

TWO OF THE GANG GUILTY

BUT ALL ARE REMANDED TO JAIL FOR A WEEK.

What the Detectives Have Discovered Concerning Any Number of Young Men About Town During the Past Thirty Days—Scores of Dishonest Youths on the Carpet.

The Police Court was crowded yesterday afternoon when the four young robbers, William and Edward Archer, George Bennett and William Norris, were called to answer the charge of robbery. They did not seem to be at all concerned about their position. They leaned coolly against the railing of the prisoners' dock and quietly took a look around the crowded court.

Against three three charges were read, that of robbing the establishment of Aumon Davis, of robbing F. Roberts and of attempting to rob the Home Savings and Loan Company's establishment. All elected to be tried summarily. Bennett, the leader of the gang, and his right hand supporter, Norris, pleaded guilty, but the Archers pleaded not guilty. The cases were enlarged for a week, the Crown not being prepared to go on.

The accused, with the exception of Edward Archer, are all small in stature and meagre in appearance. Edward Archer is a broad-shouldered boy of 20. He has brown hair, a square face and a broad brow. His eyes are light gray. His face is intelligent and much finer looking than that of any of his companions. He is 5 feet 9 1/2 inches in height and carries himself with an easy confidence.

George Bennett, the leader of the gang, is small and spare. His features are sharp and his eyes shifting. He has prominent cheek bones and gray eyes. His head is small and his brow narrow and sloping. He stands about 5 feet 6 inches high, and has a bulldog face. His nose is flat and turned up. His eyes are brown. He has a prominent mouth and cheekbones, and thick lips, but his chin is weak.

William Norris is of medium height and rather thin. He has dark hair and gray eyes. His mouth and chin are weak, and his appearance as a whole would lead one to conjecture that it would be easy for a stronger man to lead him into crime.

The activity of the detective force the past few weeks in consequence of the recent daring burglaries has been fraught with grief and shame to many a household, and has resulted in the exposure of a large number of skirmishers or auxiliaries, as it were, on the banks of the regular army of thieves. The result of their investigations has been to show that the thefts of articles by young clerks or salesmen from their employers have become increasingly common in the city. In several cases the thefts were brought home to the young men, but their employers declined to prosecute.

There are several causes for the increase of this particular class of crime. Beyond doubt the tastes and habits of the young men of today are more expensive than those of their fathers with all their means, or means at all. They dress up as "managers" and smoke choice cigars, attend theatres, concerts, balls and race meetings. If often indulges in these rather expensive luxuries, and as the supply of youths anxious for general employment is always in excess of the demand, the salaries given are in many cases low. Then firms are sometimes very lax in the oversight of their men in their employ. It seems easy to take a small article. After the first false step the descent is rapid, and many a young man fills a felon's cell, or has to fly to his mother's carelessness as well as his own folly.

The Queen's Bench Division yesterday gave judgment in the appeal by Dr. N. Washington of Toronto from the order of the Council of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario, erasing his name from the register of the college. The Doctor was registered in 1872, and the order striking off his name was made in June last. The complaint against the appellant was chiefly that he advertised extensively in Ottawa, publishing in the newspapers certificates from persons he had cured; that he had been guilty of disrespectful conduct in connection with some patients in Kingston in the last stages of consumption, taking money from them; that he had advertised in Ottawa by means of handbills, and that he had published statements showing the symptoms of catarrh, thereby leading ignorant persons to believe that they were afflicted with that disease. The appellant contended that the complaints made against him were not proved, and that they did not come within the purview of the Medical Act.
