The Great Maritime Nations.

Canada stands fifth among the maritime countries of the world. The latest reports give the following number of vessels and tonnage to the chief commercial nations:

The United States are not here given the place they should have, as only vessels registered for ocean trade are accounted for. If licensed and enrolled vessels are included, the tonnage will reach \$414,457.
