

The roundtable was held at DFAIT headquarters on 17 July, 1998. David Malone (DG, Global and Human Issues, DFAIT) and Narissa Bhambhani (Canadian Centre for Foreign Policy Development) welcomed the participants to this opportunity to contribute to the development of Canada's policy response to the discussion within the context of Canada's membership in the Security Council, and expressed the hope that the roundtable would further Canada's efforts to bring a distinctive, pro-active approach to the Council.
