

(f) Prohibit all immigration which might be inimical to her fundamental institutions and which might constitute, in her mining centres, seats of disorder and agencies of revolutionary propaganda.

It was Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until to-morrow.

It being six o'clock, the Honourable the Speaker left the Chair to resume the same at half-past seven o'clock.

The Senate resumed.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (74), intituled: "An Act to establish a corporation to be known as Trans-Canada Air Lines," was read the second time, and—

Referred to the Standing Committee on Railways, Telegraphs and Harbours.

The Order of the Day being called for the second reading of the Bill (84), intituled: "An Act to amend the Customs Act," it was—

Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (85), intituled: "An Act to revive and amend The Business Profits War Tax Act, 1916," was read the second time.

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (86), intituled: "An Act respecting a certain Trade Agreement between Canada and Uruguay," was read the second time.

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (88), intituled: "An Act respecting Department of Transport Stores," was read the second time, and—

Referred to the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce.
