CANADIAN ARMED FORCES—REPLACEMENT VEHICLE FOR M-37 ¾-TON CARGO VEHICLES

Question No. 1,519—**Mr. Rowland:**

1. Are the Canadian Armed Forces currently conducting evaluation tests of a possible replacement vehicle for the M-37 ¾-ton cargo vehicles currently in service?
2. What are the names of the vehicles and their manufacturers currently being considered for this role?
3. What is the anticipated total cost of this purchase program?
4. What is the number of vehicles it is anticipated will be purchased and what is the anticipated per unit cost?
5. Will any eventual purchase contract contain the provision that the vehicle must be constructed in Canada?
6. Will any eventual purchase contract contain provisions for regional distribution of expenditures on the vehicle?
7. On what date may an announcement with respect to the letting of a contract be expected?

Mr. John M. Reid (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): I am informed by the Departments of National Defence and Supply and Services as follows: 1. Yes, evaluation trials are under way and are expected to end in June 1973.

2. Truck Utility 1¼-ton Chrysler Model XW350, Chrysler Canada Ltd., Windsor, Canada. Truck Utility Rover 101 Series, 1 Metric ton, The Rover Company Ltd., Warwickshire, England. 3 and 4. Sufficient information is not yet available to allow a realistic estimate of either the unit or total program costs to be made at this time. It is expected, however, that approximately 3,300 vehicles may be purchased.

5. The provisions of the purchase contract cannot be determined until the source of supply has been selected. It is Canadian government policy always to take Canadian content into consideration when selecting a source of supply.

6. No special contract provisions are contemplated at this time.

7. As no decision has been made on which vehicle may be selected, no date has been set for any announcement.
