EVERY farmer has now decided on which field to sow this or that particular crop. He now only awaits fine weather and a dry soil to commence operations. In the mean time there is work enough to do. Ploughs, harrows, rollers, carts, harness, &c., should be examined, and if repairs are needed, they should be made before the busy season commences. Seed wheat, potatoes, oats, timothy, clover, peas, &c., should now be procured. The shortness of our sowing season makes it pre-eminently desirable that the farmer, above all others, should take time by the forelock. Too many neglect all preparation for their spring work, and when the fine weather comes, having everything to do in a few weeks, they are in too great a hurry to do anything well. They must plow over a furrow 16 inches wide, scratch it a little with a harrow, sow the seed, and trust to "good luck" and a virgin soil for a harvest.
