CITY BUSINESS WOULD GAIN BY INTRODUCTION OF RADIALS

Provincial Hydro-Commission is Prepared to Finance a System of Suburban Railway Lines Thruout Metropolitan Area—Toronto Must Take Initiative by Providing a Terminal.

Members of the city council who are seriously studying the proposed reports and correspondence in relation to the projected clean-up of the franchise within the city limits, are commenting upon the importance given by the experts to the bringing of the radial lines into the heart of the city.

The experts leave no doubt as to their opinion that the entrance of the radial lines to the centre of the business section would have a very marked effect upon the city's business and financial life.

This partnership plan means that with the backing of the municipal corporation, the provincial Hydro-Electric Commission would construct the radial lines and assume their operation without any deficit by getting additional revenues thru selling electric light and power along the lines of those suburban railroads.

It will be pointed out at the meeting that the true value of establishing municipal control of street railway and electric light and power service is not clear as to why the city should not clean up the franchise and let the Hydro-Electric Commission take over the operation.
