on attacking them at the Ohio, we shall be little or no Gainers by what we may recover there, as the French would still have most of the Indians included within their Bounds, and at the fame Time have it in their Power so to employ them, as to distress, or indeed utterly destroy, any Settlement we may hereafter attempt to make at the Ohio. Therefore if the French, by their Intrigues and Address, can make us rest satisfied with the Appearance of a Conquest, which will not in any Respect be of Service to us, they will only amuse us by false Hopes and Pretences, engross the Indian Trade, and in the End
